

Attendance

Your attendance will be monitored on a daily basis. If your attendance is not above 95% it will start to become a concern and you will be spoken to and parents can be fined. It is essential you keep your attendance high so that you do not miss learning. **Our approach is extremely SUPPORTIVE to begin with.**

Key Takeaway

Attendance Streaks

Vision: To ensure that students see attendance as a positive and rewarding element.

To prepare students for GCSE and ensure that they access all education to succeed and achieve positive outcomes.



Student attends one full week (both AM and PM session).




Tutor reads the Attendance Streak list out for their form. Tutor hands the raffle ticket over to the student (these will be in form trays).



Progress Leader will come round with their Attendance Streak box and collect raffle tickets. This box will be placed safely into KS3/KS4.



At the end of the half term, student/students will receive a prize. The more raffle tickets with their name on, the higher their chances.



At the end of the term, the winning tutor group from each year group will receive a prize in celebration assembly.





"The students have done really well," he said.



These group meetings are designed to facilitate communication between the Headteacher and parents and carers and acts as a consultative group.


This will be an exciting opportunity for home and school to work together with the aim of continually improving our school for the benefit of all our students as well as the school community as a whole.
