

Top 10 attributes university admission officers look for (in addition to academic qualifications and grades):

- 1. Propensity to complete degree 99% of officers
- 2. Evidence of passion for chosen subject 95%
- 3. Good written English 95%
- 4. Evidence of positive attitude towards study 91%
- 5. Evidence of ability to think/work independently 90%
- 6. Confidence with basic maths 80%
- 7. Ability to persevere and complete tasks 79%
- 8. Good presentation skills 72%
- 9. Ability to work well in groups 60%
- 10. Intercultural awareness 28%
